

Something You Don't Know (YouTube)

- 1. The site was started in February 2005, 8 years ago. It was bought by Google in November 2006, less than 2 years after it started, for \$1.65 billion.
- 2. Over 1.9 billion people visit the site every month.
- 3. Over 300 hours of video are uploaded to the site every minute, about 300,000 videos every day and there are approximately² 5,000,000,000 videos on YouTube. 46,296 videos are watched every second around the world.
- 4. The most watched video on YouTube is Despacito by Luis Fonsi with 5.6 billion views so far.
- 5. YouTube is worth³ about \$45 billion these days.
- 6. The first YouTube video is "Me at the zoo".




How to see a magic eye picture.

YouTube Goes Down for Two Hours and Mayhem Ensues





The church is 70% complete but there are still 10 enormous spires that have to be lifted into place. Many people visit the church every year and their entrance fees pay the \$40 million a year construction costs.
