



Einstein Puzzle Solved


Albert Einstein spent the last 30 years of his life working on a unified field theory⁶. His idea was that everything in nature could be explained in one theory. He wrote many papers about this and left a huge library of documents. However, one page of an 8-page appendix⁷ that explained more about his theory was missing. Experts were unable to understand what he was saying because of the one missing page.





Last month, the Hebrew University in Jerusalem bought 110 Einstein letters from a doctor in Chicago. They were analyzing the letters and they realized that one of them was the missing page from the appendix to the unified theory. When it was placed back in its proper place, everything suddenly became clearer. This will help the physicists⁸ continue their work trying to prove Einstein's Unified Field Theory.

The Hebrew University is now the biggest repository⁹ for Einstein documents in the world. They have 82,000 letters, writings and other items. Some of the letters deal with scientific discoveries, while some of them are letters to his son. In one letter to his son, he says that he is concerned about the rise of the Nazi Party¹⁰ in Germany. Einstein was fluent in German, English, and French and his writings are in a mix of those three languages. They are all online, if you are interested.


