
## **ET and Elliott Reunite**






## Why do we...

... use Christmas trees? The evergreen fir tree<sup>4</sup> has been a symbol of pagan religion<sup>5</sup> for thousands of years. It stays green even in the cold winter and reminds people of life and growth. Pagans used to put a branch<sup>6</sup> in their homes over the winter solstice to remind them of the spring to come. Romans used to put decorated fir trees in their temples. The first Christmas was celebrated in 336AD, but the Christmas tree didn't become associated<sup>7</sup> with it until about 1500. A tree was put up in the town square and people danced around it. At the end of the festival it was burned. The first tree in a house was in about 1650 but most people were poor and made do with a branch. The first artificial<sup>8</sup> tree was made in 1880 and used goose<sup>9</sup> feathers.
