

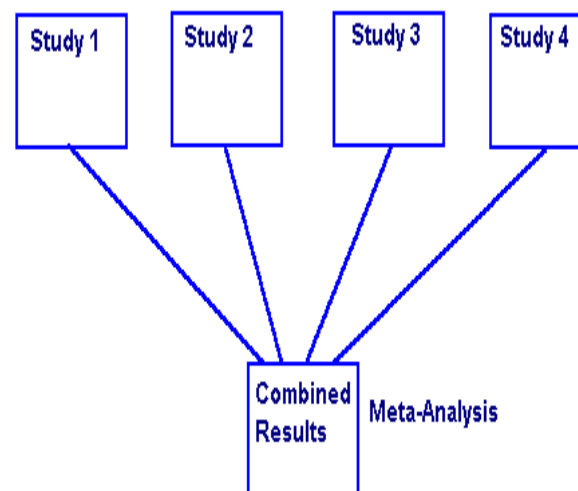

Something Interesting (Coffee)

1. Coffee comes from and was first drunk in Ethiopia⁴.
2. It came to Arabia⁵ from there and then into Europe in the late 16th century.
3. The word coffee comes from the Dutch⁶ *koffie*, which come from the Turkish *kahve*, which comes from the Arabic *qahwah*, which means "to lack⁷ hunger".
4. Finland drinks the most coffee per person per year. The average is about 12kg.
5. Kopi Luwak is the most expensive coffee in the world. The beans are eaten by an Indonesian wildcat and then collected after the animal excretes⁸ them. This coffee costs \$700 per kg.
6. Black Insomnia is the world's strongest coffee. A 350ml cup has 702 milligrams⁹ of caffeine. A typical¹⁰ Starbucks coffee has 195. That would probably kill me.
7. The first coffee shop in Japan was opened in 1888, in Tokyo.

Coffee is (mostly) good for you

I started drinking coffee when I was 16 years old. I've drunk it pretty¹¹ regularly¹² since then. Every year there is a new study that says coffee is good for you, then one that says coffee is bad for you. Some researchers¹³ at the University of Catania, Italy, decided to find out. They looked at 127 meta-analyses¹⁴ that had lumped together¹⁵ research on similar coffee related topics. All of the research looked at the health benefits¹⁶.



The researchers gave each meta-analysis a score from "convincing¹⁷" down to "limited¹⁸". Convincing means the study shows obvious¹⁹ health benefits. Limited means that there was no evidence²⁰. What they found is that no study showed "convincing". Some studies showed a strong link between drinking 5 cups of coffee a day and a lowered risk²¹ of various diseases, however there was no definitive proof²².

However, one good thing the study was able to do was to explain the link between coffee and high blood pressure²³ and cancer. What they found is that most smokers are also coffee drinkers. When they looked only at non-smokers, this risk was found to disappear, which means the risk comes from smoking, not coffee. So, drink coffee, in moderation²⁴, but don't smoke.

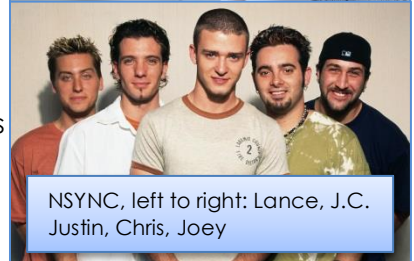

Justin Timberlake is an American singer-songwriter, actor and record producer. He was born in Memphis, Tennessee, on January 31, 1981. As a child, he was a contestant on the television show *Star Search*, but lost. He was also a cast member of *The All-New Mickey Mouse Club*, along with Britney Spears and Ryan Gosling. From the late 1990s to early 2000s, Timberlake was a member of the idol group NSYNC, which became one of the best-selling boy bands of all time. He released his debut solo album, *Justified* in 2002. His second album, *FutureSex/LoveSounds* was released in 2006. From 2008 through 2012, Timberlake focused on his acting career. He started making music again in 2013 with his third and fourth albums, *The 20/20 Experience* and *The 20/20 Experience – 2 of 2*. His fifth studio album *Man of the Woods* was released on February 2, 2018, and he headlined the Super Bowl Halftime Show over the weekend to promote his new album. Timberlake has won many awards during his career, including ten Grammy Awards, four Emmy Awards, three Brit Awards, and nine Billboard Music Awards. According to Billboard in 2017, he is the best performing male soloist in the history of the Mainstream Top 40. Krystal has been a huge fan of Justin Timberlake for 20 years.
