


Something you didn't know about the solar system:

- 1. The edge of the solar system² is about 18.4 billion km away from the sun. It is the point where the wind from the sun stops.
- 2. 99.8% of all the mass³ in the solar system is in the sun. The remaining 0.2% is all the planets. The sun is very very big.
- 3. The solar system is 4.57 billion years old.
- 4. Our solar system orbits⁴ the Milky Way Galaxy at 828.000 km/h. It takes us 230 million years to orbit the galaxy once. That means we have only orbited the galaxy about 20 times.

The Planets Align

Last Friday, five planets and the moon were visible⁵ in the sky at the same time. This is very rare⁶, and it hasn't happened since 2004. It won't happen again until 2040. They were still visible until this morning. Did any of you seem them? You needed to get up before sunrise, which is 03:57. That's maybe a little early to get up. It is unusual to be able to see Mercury as well because it is usually impossible to see because of the bright light from the sun. Another unusual fact about the event is that all of the planets appear in the order that they are positioned from the sun. A lineup⁷ of five planets happens about every 20 years. A lineup of six planets happens about once every hundred years. The last time was in 200, so I won't see another one of those. You all might. It is very rare for all of the planets to line up. If you want to set a reminder on your phone, all seven of the planets (obviously not Earth as well because we have to be on that to see the other seven) will line up on May 6th, 2492. Coincidentally⁸, that is my 515th birthday. If the weather is clear, all of the planets are visible with the naked eye⁹.

A building

This week let's look at the Roman forum³. The Roman forum was the seat of the Roman government⁴. People from this building controlled an empire that stretched from Africa, through Europe, to the edge⁵ of Russia. The forum was started in about 650 BC. Many different kings added to it over the years. Rome became a republic⁶ in 509 BC and the forum became more important. It was the main court for Rome and all the laws were made here. Building on the forum finished in 312 AD when Emperor Constantine made the last change to it. By this time it was less important and a lot of government work had moved to other buildings and other towns. The Roman Empire fell in 476 AD and the forum was no longer used. It started to fall down and a lot of the bricks were used to build other buildings. By the 13th century, the area had become a dumping ground⁷. In 1550, Pope Paul III used a lot of the bricks to build St. Paul's Basilica, the most famous church in the Vatican. It was only in 1803, that people started to excavate⁸ and take care of the building again. The Industrial Revolution increased education levels and gave people more of an interest in history. A lot of countries start to care for their old buildings from about this time. By 1898, the forum had been restored¹⁰ as much as possible.
