### Something you didn't know about Tetris

1. Tetris was made in 1984 by a Russian computer programmer called Alexey Pajitnov. His job was to make games to test the power of Soviet<sup>3</sup> computers. He also wanted to show people computers were easy to learn.
2. The name Tetris comes from the Greek word "tetra", meaning 4 and "tennis".
3. Pajitnov was in the Soviet Union<sup>4</sup> and he couldn't sell his game. He had to give the rights<sup>5</sup> to the Soviet government<sup>6</sup>. The Soviet government then sold the rights of the game to Nintendo. Pajitnov didn't make any more from the game until the rights returned to him in 1996.
4. The Tetris theme song is a 19<sup>th</sup> century Russian folk song<sup>7</sup>.

### 13-Year-Old Beats Tetris

Do you know the game Tetris? I'll put a picture of it for you. Maybe you have played it. I think everybody in my generation knows it. It was one of the most popular games in the world when I was growing up. If you have never played it, here is an explanation<sup>8</sup>. Different shaped blocks come down from the top of the screen. You can turn the blocks around as they move down the screen. You have to fit<sup>9</sup> them into the other blocks already on the screen. If you make a line of blocks across the screen, that line disappears<sup>10</sup> and all of the blocks move down one space. You get points. If you cannot fit the blocks in and they pile up and reach the top of the screen, you lose. When you get enough points, you move up to the next level. As the levels get higher, the blocks come down faster and faster until a human can't keep up. AI can beat it, but a human can't. Until a 13-year-old boy called Willis Gibson managed to do it. And, what happens at the end of the game? It freezes. The game code was not designed to go so high and when Willis reached level 157, the game crashed<sup>11</sup>. He is the first person to ever achieve this. Do you want to try? You can find versions of the game online and there is probably an app for your phone. It is fun, but frustrating<sup>12</sup>.

### One thing we can do to help the environment

#### #12 Stop Using a Plastic Sponge

I started doing this over the winter vacation and I have not been successful yet. My shower sponge was a regular<sup>4</sup> sponge from the hundred yen shop. It was old, so I needed to get a new one. I realized<sup>5</sup> that cheap sponges are made of plastic, and my sponge will become a source of microplastics. I decided to stop using plastic sponges. I wanted to buy a sea sponge<sup>6</sup>, but I realized that they are animals, not plants. I don't feel good washing myself with a dead animal, so I have tried something else. There are many sponges made from the fibers<sup>7</sup> of different plants. I bought a sponge made of plant fiber first. Plant fiber is sustainable<sup>8</sup>, but the sponge wasn't very good. It was like a ball of string<sup>9</sup> and I couldn't get any foam<sup>10</sup> from it. It hurt a lot to use. Then I bought a sponge made from bamboo fiber and something called polylactic acid<sup>11</sup>, which is a plastic made from plants, such as corn or sugar cane. It behaves very much like a plastic, but it is biodegradable<sup>12</sup>. It does have some problems, and it is not perfect, but it is better for the environment than my plastic sponge.
