

World record

Here are some tree records. The world's tallest tree is called Hyperion and it is a coast redwood. It is 116.07 meters tall. It is estimated¹ to be about 800 years old. Several years ago, one of its branches broke off and made a crater² in the road! The branch had a diameter of 2 m! 800 years is very old, but that doesn't make Hyperion the oldest tree in

the world. The oldest tree is the Great Basin bristlecone pine, and it is estimated to be 4,856 years old. That tree grows pretty slowly. The fastest growing tree in the world is the hose tamarind. It can grow 6 m a year! Bamboo grows very quickly as well, but bamboo is a grass and not a tree. Here is another record. These days, many people are planting trees to try and help the environment. Well, there are several tree planting world records. Here are some of them. The most trees planted in 24 hours by one person is 23,060. The most trees planted at the same time by multiple people³ is 2,294,629! They actually planted over four million trees, but Guinness only counted 2.3 million of them.

An Unusual Job

Tree Surgeon

This job is not that rare, but it is interesting. A tree surgeon⁶ is a person who tries to cure⁷ sick and dying trees. They are called surgeons because a surgeon is a doctor who tries to cure people by operating on them. Tree surgeons are also called arborists⁸. Tree surgeons have several jobs. The first is to try and diagnose⁹ what is wrong with a tree. It might have picked up a parasite¹⁰, it might have a disease, and it might be dying from another cause. If they can cure it, they will try. Sometimes they can't cure the tree and then they have a few options¹¹. The first option is to cut off the part of the tree that is diseased and hope that it hasn't already spread. If that doesn't stop the spread of the disease, then they might have to cut down that tree so the disease doesn't spread to other trees. They are experts in tree removal. They have other jobs as well. They have to trim trees if they are too top heavy¹² and look like they might fall down. They have to relocate trees sometimes. And they have to move trees that get blown over in storms. They have many other jobs as well. It sounds like a very interesting job. You have to be ok with heights, though, because they climb a lot of trees.
